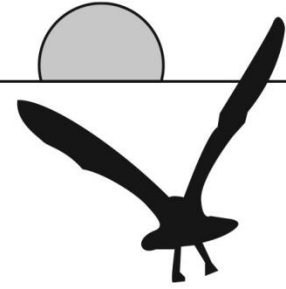


Wildlife In Need Center

Seasonal Animal Care Staff.



General Position Guidelines:

The Seasonal Animal Care Staff assists with the care, treatment, and release of wild patients at the Wildlife in Need Center. This position is 20-24 hours per week through October 31, 2021 and reports to the Director of Animal Care.

Position Objectives:

- Quality care and treatment of all wildlife patients.
- Compliance with applicable state and federal regulations

Primary Responsibilities:

- Assists Animal Care staff for daily husbandry, exams, care and treatment of wildlife in care at WINC.
- Work with all animal care staff to determine final disposition of wild patients, to evaluate and ensure timely and appropriate release of all wildlife patients.
- Assist with enclosure set up as directed by animal care staff
- Ensure that protocols for infection/disease control are being followed.
- Assist with training of animal care volunteers as needed.
- Responsibility for adherence to WINC's animal care policies and procedures.
- Responsibility for the accuracy of patient records and individual drug use reporting.

Additional Responsibilities:

- Provide input to animal care policies and procedures.
- Assist in maintaining accurate records and good relationships with home care/foster volunteers.
- Seek assistance as needed to meet the position objectives, i.e. request specific training or identify a need for specialized equipment/supplies.
- Assist all staff in providing proper enrichment and medical care to WINC's educational ambassadors.
- Assist all staff with releases.

Responsibilities Specific for Animal Care Staff/Wildlife Rehabilitator

Qualifications:

- Experience in the field of wildlife rehabilitation
- Wildlife rehabilitation license or certification in wildlife rehabilitation preferred
- Must be able to lift/move 50 pounds, endure long workdays in a physically and emotionally demanding setting while maintaining focus, accuracy and physical activities required by the job.
