Our education animals become ambassadors for many reasons. Some of them were kept illegally when they were young, which caused them to imprint on humans and never learn proper behavior for their species. Others were injured and brought to us for medical care but could not be successfully released.

In addition to providing sanctuary to unreleasable animals that would otherwise face an uncertain fate, the Wildlife In Need Center's education programs recognize the unique effect that live animals have on people of all ages. We are proud to have them as part of our education team and grateful that they can help us teach others about Wisconsin wildlife.

We provide education programs to a variety of age groups to help build positive relationships between humans and native Wisconsin wildlife.

INTERACTIVE PROGRAMS FOR EVERYONE

Our educational programs are flexible and designed for all age groups. Our general program incorporates information about the Wildlife in Need Center and the wildlife rehabilitation work we do, as well as information about wildlife and human interactions, species identification, and their natural ecology.

Programs can be given at your school, local library, community festival and many other locations. The Wildlife in Need Center has an on-site classroom space for smaller groups that would like an education program at our center. Our programs can include our education animals, PowerPoint presentations, or both. A typical program length is 30–60 minutes.
